TELEMANN (1681-1767) Quartet TWV43:A1

Georg Philipp Telemann was born in Magdeburg, Germany. He was a contemporary of Bach and Handel and one of the most prolific composers in history.

His music incorporates French, Italian, and German national styles, and Telemann was at times even influenced by Polish popular music. His lifetime and output links the Baroque to the classical styles of Haydn and Mozart.

Part of his large chamber music output includes 6 concertos for oboe, 3 for flute as well as a concerto for 2 chalumeaux and 2 bassoons, the chalumeaux being a very early version of the clarinet.

The word 'chalumeaux' is still used today to describe the low register of the clarinet - the register that is used for most of this arrangement.

This quartet is part of a set of 6, first published in 1733. The movements sound to us like different dances for an 18th century party, the final one being a gigue.

FAURE (1845-1924) Piano Quartet Op.15

Gabriel Fauré (1845-1924) was the student of Camille Saint-Saëns (1835-1921) and teacher of Maurice Ravel (1875-1937).

The idea of the First Piano Quartet Op.15 was conceived in 1876 while Fauré was also composing the well-known Sonata for violin and piano Op.13. The piano quartet was completed three years later. However, after a few performances at the Société nationale de musique, Fauré decided to completely rewrite the last movement. Jacques Durand, a famous French music publisher, showed no interest in publishing Fauré's piano quartet. The revised edition with a new 4th movement was published in 1884 by Julien Hamelle. The music was well received by the French society. Fauré often played the piano part of this piece in chamber music performances throughout his life. The sheet music was reprinted several times for sale due to popularity.

Fauré was then awarded the Prix Chartier by the <u>Académie des Beaux-Arts</u> (Institut de France) in 1885.

Considered the true creator of French chamber music, Fauré holds a unique and original place in the music of his time. It is distinguished by the search for the balance of melodic lines, the homogeneity of the discourse, the simplicity in the expression or even the respect for old modes. He was director of the Paris Conservatoire from 1905 to 1920.

Some sections are highly chromatic, some are very *espressivo*. Between the two outer Allegro movements there is a high-spirited scherzo followed by a beautiful adagio in the character of a lament.

Harris (1955-) Divertimento

Paul Harris is an English clarinettist, composer, author and educator. He studied music at the Royal Academy of Music, and then music education at the University of London. He now works in music education in the UK, as a teacher, and an examiner and adjudicator in national events including the Chamber Music for Schools Competition, and the BBC Young Musician of the Year.

He has composed prolifically for developing musicians, as well as more substantial works such as 7 concertos, a ballet and a children's opera. Faber music has published his 'Buckingham' concertos (1993-1997) No.5, which can be found on YouTube.

Some of his compositions feature in the album 'Clarinet Chamber Music' published by Clarinet Classics. He has over 600 publications to date, such as books on clarinet technique, musical theory, his teaching method (Simultaneous Learning) and on living with cancer (Cancer and positivity). He has also co-authored major new biographies of Sir Malcolm Arnold, Malcolm Williamson, and Sir Richard Rodney Bennett.

Divertimento was published in 1998 and is described by the publisher as "a useful & tuneful work for talented players".
