— REFRESHMENTS —

**Johann Sebastian Bach (1685 – 1750) *Cantata BWV 208 – Sheep May Safely Graze***

This Cantata is a secular choral work and is described as Bach's Hunting Cantata – a reference to its opening text: "The lively hunt is all my heart's desire." Its most familiar aria is the ninth movement, *Schafe können sicher weiden*. Bach composed this music for the birthday of Duke Christian of Saxe-Weissenfels in 1713. This work is also recognised as the birthday cantata.

**Ludwig van Beethoven (1770 – 1827) *Sonata for Piano & Violin E-flat Major No 3 Op 12***

*Sonata Op 12 No 3*, is a work of genius. The first movement keeps both instruments moving. The second movement, at times reminiscent of an operatic aria, starts with a serene melody that evolves slowly. The violin sings in long lines over a murmuring accompaniment, then trades roles with the piano. The cheerful finale is a rondo on a cheeky theme. Unexpectedly, the middle section falls into the minor mode and hints at some brief, mild conflict between the instruments. This is soon swept away by another surprise, a fugal treatment of the main theme that leads straight into a brief, high-spirited coda.

**Johan Helmich Roman (1694 – 1758) *Four pieces from The Drottningholm Music***

*The Drottningholm Music* (Swedish: Drottningholmsmusiken) is the popular name of the music that was composed by Johan Helmich Roman and first performed at Drottningholm Palace at Lovön, near Stockholm in 1744 at the wedding of Crown Prince Adolf Frederick and Princess Louisa Ulrika of Prussia. The suite consists of thirty three movements and for this performance we will hear four movements. The movements are diverse in character; there is music both for ceremonious entries and for dance, for example minuets. The wedding was celebrated in three days, under which the royal orchestra, was directed by Roman.

**The Gipsy Kings – *Inspiration*** (arr. R. Charlton)

The lively song *Inspiration* is from the third album of French Rumba Catalana band Gipsy Kings. It famously appeared in the season five episode of Miami Vice, "World Of Trouble", in 1988.

**Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756 – 1791) *Divertimento in Bb for Oboe, Clarinet and Bassoon, K 439b (c. 1781-1785)***

*Divertimento* in Bb is from a manuscript collection of 25 pieces composed in Vienna circ. 1781. The movements may have been written as basset-horn trios, however the first published arrangements specified two clarinets and bassoon; or two clarinets, two horns and bassoon; or two basset-horns and bassoon. In an early arrangement, it was scored for Oboe, Clarinet and Bassoon and in this ensemble today, the flute substitutes the Oboe.

**Michael Praetorius (1571 – 1621) *Ballet and Volta* from the *Terpsichore***

*Ballet* and *Volta* are Dances from the *Terpsichore* by German organist, composer, theorist and publisher, Michael Praetorius. They were published in *Terpsichore*, a collection of 312 instrumental dances in 4, 5 and 6 parts, that was his sole surviving secular work and most popular of the Renaissance period. Praetorius stated it to be a collection written for French dancers who were very good 'Geigers' (lutenists).

**Alan Silvestri (b. 1950) Theme from *Forrest Gump***

The theme from the movie *Forrest Gump* (1994) complemented the film portraying a simple man doing extraordinary things with a homespun philosophy of such quotes as - "Life is just like a box of chocolates - you never know what you're gonna get."

**Johann Sebastian Bach (1685 – 1750) *Prelude from Suite No. 1 in G Major for Unaccompanied Cello, BWV 1007***

Bach's *Six Suites for Unaccompanied Cello* circ. 1720, written when the composer was serving as Kapellmeister at the court of Anhalt-Cöthen. The *Prelude* of the *Suite No. 1 in G Major*, mainly consisting of arpeggiated chords, moves along a steady pulse of sixteenth-notes, and it is the responsibility of the performer to breathe musical life—manipulation of tempo, contrasts of dynamics within phrases, the gradual building to a great climax—into these otherwise bare sequences of steady notes.

**Richard Charlton (b. 1955) *Viva Jujuy***

*Viva Jujuy* is an adaptation and arrangement of traditional South American melodies by Australian guitarist Richard Charlton. The title also shares the same name of a love song by Mercedes Sosa and Charlton uses this as a basis of this work for guitar ensemble.
