— NOTES —

Beethoven (1770 – 1827)

This early work is one of the first classical cello sonatas and still a staple of the repertoire.

Today played by Robyn and Nick.

Brahms (1833 – 1897)

Brahms' 2nd piano trio in C, completed in 1882. 2nd movement performed today. Takes the form of a theme and variations

Inge joins Robyn and Nick.

Chopin (1810 – 1849)

Piano ballades are elaborate one-section works which are considered an innovation of Chopin's. Chopin's ballades have a loose form and themes which are narrative in character. The third ballade in A-flat major was published in 1841, with a dedication to the composer's pupil, Pauline de Noailles.

Played by Iona Luke.

Schubert (1797 – 1828)

This string quartet is nicknamed 'Rosamunde' because of a tune taken from Schubert's famous incidental music for a play. Also features other tunes used by Schubert in songs.

Today played by Stephen, Greta, Danny and Nicole.

Piazzolla (1921 – 1992) Argentinian composer and master of the bandoneón.

This piece is the first of a set of four pieces representing the development of tango music over the last 100 years.

Played today by Sally & Nick.
